


10 Tips to Skill Tracking

Skill Tracking is a new feature in the GPS for the 2014-15 school year. Educators can use the Individual Track Skill area to chart progress on student's IEP goals or growth in specific skill areas. Group tracking can also be used to measure group success on selected subsets of students. This feature can be used to support Student Learning Targets (SLTs) or Student Learning Objectives (SLOs).

Skill tracking provides all resources to introduce, teach, practice, support and assess targeted skills. It pulls together all of the powerful tools n2y provides in one place to encourage data driven decisions and progression toward goal achievement. With one press of a button!



Skill Tracking Tip #1

Create a New Profile on Your Student

A current profile gives the educational team the best picture of the student's present abilities and level of performance.



Skill Tracking Tip #2

Track Skills Individually


Use the Individual Track Skill area to chart progress on student's IEP goals or growth in specific skill areas. Skills can be tracked from the Profile, Benchmark Assessments & Core Rubrics. To begin tracking a skill on an individual, click the blue Track Skill button and select "Track this skill for the individual."





Skill Tracking Tip #3 Watch the Data Plot

Once a skill is chosen for tracking, any Benchmark Assessments taken that address the chosen skill will be graphed. Hover over the plots on the graph for a quick view of the date and score of assessment. Use the Toggle Graphs button to add or remove assessments from the view.



Skill Tracking Tip #4

Add Goals to Skill Areas

Current specific performance and suggested strategies for the targeted skill is provided, as indicated by the Profile. Use the Skill Goal area to write the goal for the student related to the selected skill area. This is a great place to write the student's IEP goal.




Skill Tracking Tip #5

Related Materials

The Individual tracked skill area will provide a Related material section that pulls all components of Unique Learning System, News-2-You and SymbolStix ONLINE that address and aid in the student's acquisition of the designated tracked skill.

- Standards that align to the skill are reported.
- A list of Benchmark Assessments that address the skill are provided. The tests can be launched for administration directly from this page.
- · Checkpoint results are provided in a graph if the designated skill is addressed in the Monthly Checkpoint assessments.
- Unique Monthly Lessons indicates each lesson monthly that addresses the targeted skill. Lessons can be launched directly from this page as well.
- Unique Supporting Activities area pulls each supporting activity, ULS guide, ULS tool and any additional ULS material that can help either practice, teach or support a targeted skill.
- News-2-You Lesson area indicates specific sections of the News-2-You paper and website that can be used to practice
 designated targeted skills.
- The **News-2-You Activities** area highlights games and activities within News-2-You that can be used to practice designated targeted skills.
- The SymbolStix Template area highlights specific templates that can be used to create custom activities to address and support targeted skills.




Skill Tracking Tip #6

Create Groups to Track Skill on Subsets of Students


Use the Group Track Skills area to view the progress of specific skills for identified groups of students. The Group Tracking area can be used to track progress toward Student Learning Targets or to track progress skills in subsets of students for any grouping combination, such as morning and afternoon classes or by differentiated level.



To create a new group, select Settings under Group Skill Tracking.




Add a new group with the Add Group button. Then, add students and skills to the group. You can add as many grouping combinations as your heart desires in the GPS!



Skill Tracking Tip #7


Benchmark Testing Performance

The Group Tracking area reports the Benchmark testing performance of a defined group of students and is associated with a designated targeted skill. The group tracking provides a view of each student's performance in the Benchmarks that assess targeted skills, allowing for quick data interpretation and identification of students in need of support. Detailed performance information can be gathered by clicking on the student name above the graph.





To access your groups, click Group Tracked Skill from the GPS and select the group from the Groups tab on the left. Click on a skill to view the intuitive graphs.




Skill Tracking Tip #8

Add Students & Skills to Groups

Students and skills can be added to existing groups from the Profile, Benchmark Assessments and Core Rubrics. To add a new student to a skill, select "Add individual to a skill tracking group" from the Track Skill button.



Then, select the group you wish to add the student to, or create a brand new group.

Track Progress with the Press of a Button

The track skills area allows teachers to quickly track the progress toward goal achievement, by individual (for IEPs etc) or group (for SLT etc).
